Over the years, the competition has more than 1,000 entries and today, it is one of the most reputed and anticipated furniture design challenges in the country.

THEME

The theme and wood brings together Malaysia's position as a key world exporter and producer of timber-based furniture.

"Living Furniture, Global Perspective" highlights furniture design and innovation for an increasingly globalised world by observing the current lifestyles of consumers and global demand. And to inspire participants to think furniture as an integral part of life, and a way of life.

An important judging criterion is how the design breathes the soul of wood .The extra challenge this year is for participants to expand their designs into a collection or series to accommodate the global buying trend.

THE DESIGN

Rebung Shelves is made of Malaysia's world famous rubberwood. Its sturdy shelves are slanted with metal joints to hold loads firmly. The beauty of the design is enhanced by the technology used in bending the wood.

"Rebung Shelves is a design from nature, named after the bamboo shoot or pucuk rebung in Malay. In addition to the beauty of the bamboo shoot, Rebung Shelves is inspired by its presence in Malaysian culture in the form of traditional motifs and patterns. It is even featured on the Malaysian Ringgit."

THE DESIGN

Every layer of the wooden *Muk Sofa* serves a function. It has attachable additional drawer storage, a side table and the 2+1 seating cushion makes it suitable for home and public areas.

"Muk is derived from the Chinese word "木" which means wood. It is inspired by the traditional human lifestyle where people use to live closely with the straw mat for most of their daily activities."

THE DESIGN

Art and architecture comes together in *Ling* which takes its name from the Chinese pull bell (*cheling*). In shape, it is designed after the traditional Chinese yo-yo, otherwise known as *diabolo*, which is made up of two discs connected by an axle.

"Asia's rich culture and diversity have important values to influence modernisation. For instance, the design of the diabolo has varied through history. As society evolves, the demand on the design of a functional object also becomes much more important. Furniture these days is not only expected to be user-friendly, but aesthetically pleasing as well."







45 DEGREES

THE DESIGN

45 Degrees is an experimental design on creating visual impact with materials. A simple, cubical structure frames geometrical form materials inside it, creating an interesting contrast of colour, textures and finishing.

"Design is a tool for designers to show their values. I design with a purpose, making use of quality materials and paying attention to details to make great things cheaper and cheap things greater."









Dim Stool is ergonomically designed to give a positive seating experience. It can also be used as a small side table with storage by removing the top cushion.

"The prototype is exactly what I have in mind. The design is inspired from small baskets used to steam Cantonese dim sum reminiscent of yum cha (drinking tea) and traditional tea houses along the ancient Silk Road where travellers stop to rest."

THE DESIGN

Cheng Ho Chair is a modern take of the giant masted-junks that carried China's famous ancient mariner Admiral Zheng He through his epic voyages. The backrest is segmented and the seat curves upward to form the armrests. Rear tapered legs meet to create a single spine.

"Inspired by his success story, this piece of furniture seeks to revive the glory of the Admiral's voyages and Oriental maritime influence. The Cheng Ho Chair eludes a sense of nostalgia through its form. The seat and armrests integrates two elements into one, like the crew of a ship working as a single unit to ensure a smooth journey."

Dudoo is an easy chair inspired by "Ketupat" and "Zongzi", rice dumplings wrapped in leaves by the Malay and Chinese communities. It features a simple wooden frame with arm support and extra comfort from a one-piece cushion that goes over the wooden frame.

"The idea is to transform the creative and unique way of using leaves into the design. Dudoo's flexibility and interesting features makes it appealing for home and public areas."

THE DESIGN

Scandinavian in name, inspired by Chinese traditional roof architecture, SKOG Table is a work desk with a combination of wood and contrasting laminated white finishing; a white board panel for jotting notes, lift-up drawer for storage, arch shape edge to prevent things sliding off the table and a cable organiser system.

"Scandinavian aesthetic is the trend in modern living lifestyle. Skog is the Swedish word for wood. I like to draw whenever I travel but it is often difficult to find a work space that fits my sketch book, laptop and art stuff. I was truly attracted by the traditional Chinese curved roof architecture that I saw in Penang, and that's how SKOG was inspired and designed."
